Medication Policies

PLEASE SAVE TOP PORTION FOR FUTURE REFERENCE

In accordance with the State of New Jersey's education statutes, LCCS maintains the following policies regarding medication at school:

- **MOST MEDICATION FOR SCHOOL REQUIRES A DOCTOR'S NOTE.**
Sometimes referred to as a "doctor's order," this is legal requirement.
- **THE BEST APPROACH FOR ANY STUDENT HEALTH MATTER IS TO CALL or E-MAIL THE SCHOOL NURSE AS THIS IS THE PERSON WHO WILL BE CARING FOR YOUR CHILD MEDICALLY.**

Teachers **DO NOT** administer medication and send all ill/injured students to the School Health Office.
- **IF YOUR CHILD NEEDS MEDICATION AT SCHOOL:**
Do not put your child or his/her classmates at risk by sending medication to school with your youngster. Call the School Nurse and give the medication directly to your child's teacher, the School Nurse or to Main Office Personnel.
- **IF YOUR CHILD HAS A CONDITION REQUIRING MEDICATION BE STORED AND GIVEN AT SCHOOL:**
Please contact the School Nurse to create a school health care plan in accordance with you, your child and his/her doctor.
- It is the policy of LCCS to contact a parent when a child is ill, particularly if fever, vomiting or severe malaise ("feeling bad") are happening.
